

May 26, 2014 - New York, NY - NYQ Books™ is proud to announce the publication of *Does She Have a Name*? by George Witte. Dramatic and intimate, the poems in *Does She Have a Name*? trace the journeys of two women—one middle aged, the other her infant granddaughter—through near-mortal encounters with medical crises. Both survive their trials, passing from life to death and back again; both face wrenching, unpredictable challenges; both emerge from years of therapy, made whole but alone, changed by experience in apparent and invisible ways.

Moving from a neonatal intensive care unit's urgent ministrations to the patient work of neurologists and speech pathologists, told from the perspectives of parent, child, husband, and witness, and exploring questions of disability, difference, and the calculated value of human life, *Does She Have a Name?* is an affecting, provocative book of poems.

George Witte is the author of two previous collections, *The Apparitioners* and *Deniability*. His poems have been published in a range of journals and anthologized in *The Best American Poetry*, *Old Flame*, *Rabbit Ears*, and *Vocabula Bound*. He received *Poetry* magazine's Frederick Bock prize, as well as a fellowship from the New Jersey Council for the Arts. The editor in chief of St. Martin's Press, he lives with his family in Ridgewood, New Jersey.
