New York, NY - Known for his warm and comforting delivery of the weather on the CBS Saturday Early Show, Ira Joe Fisher will equally delight readers with the release of his second book of poetry, *Songs From an Earlier Century*, published by NYO Books™.

Fisher's first book, *Some Holy Weight in the Village Air*, originally published by Athanata Arts, Ltd. and now in a second edition also by NYQ Books™, was heralded as "a splendid first collection filled with passionate, wry, wise, still crazy, lucid, and original" by Thomas Lux and "a moving collection and a complex vision" by Paula McLain.

In his second book, *Songs from an Earlier Century*, Fisher maintains the course of the first book, but takes the reader deeper into the New England landscape and ultimately deeper into the self as he explores that region between people and nature,

between the past and a vexing present. In straightforward poems, Fisher brings the reader along gently on his journey and explores both the natural and interior worlds of understanding with a conversational tone that feels like you are talking with an old friend on a lazy, rainy day. With both lyric and narrative verse, life is pondered, puzzled and—ultimately—celebrated.

He has acted in films and on the New York stage (for many years appearing in *The Fantasticks*). He and his wife, Shelly, and their four children live in Connecticut.
