

New York, NY - The Still Position chronicles the last days of life of the poet's difficult but cherished mother. Set in upstate New York among deer and hawks under a stone-scarred mountain, these poems reveal the death of the body and the heart's passage through loss and grief, anger and confusion, forgiveness and devotion.

Barbara Blatner is a poet, playwright and composer-musician. She lives in northern Manhattan with her husband and two cats, and teaches in the English Department at Yeshiva University. Barbara's verse play *No Star Shines Sharper* was published by Baker's Plays (1991), produced for radio and aired repeatedly on NPR stations. Her plays have been produced in New York, Boston and Cleveland.
